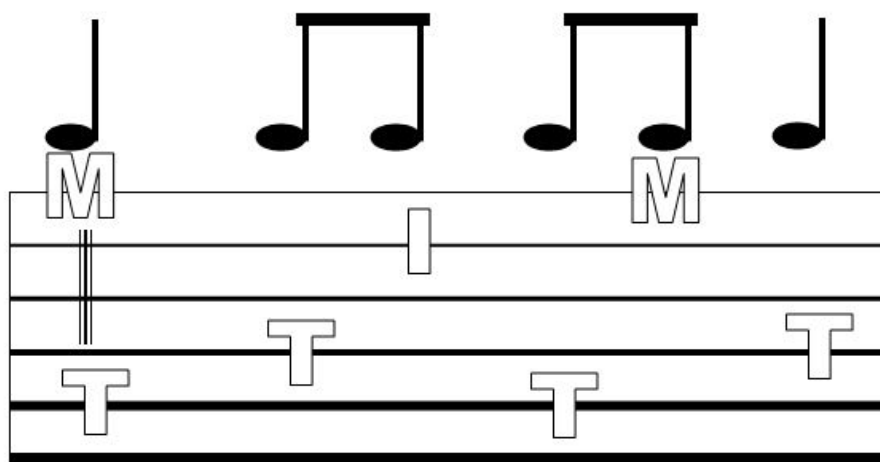

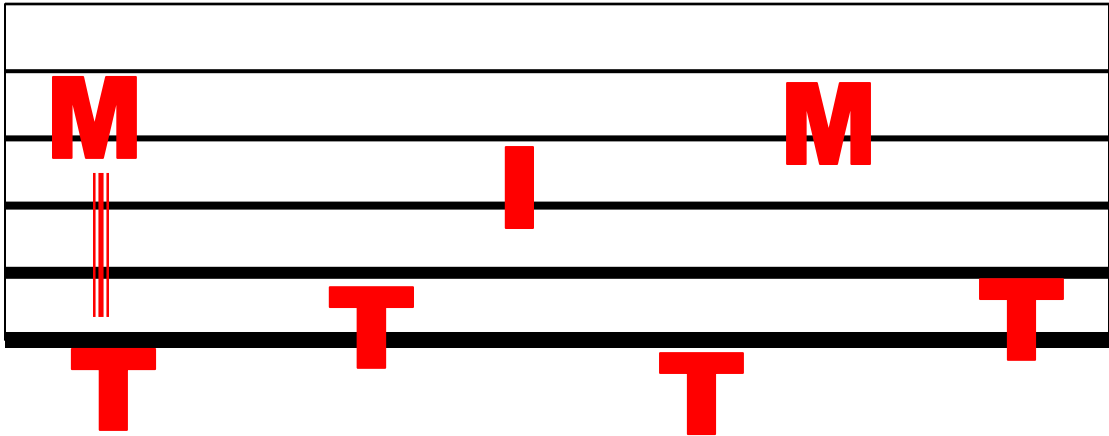

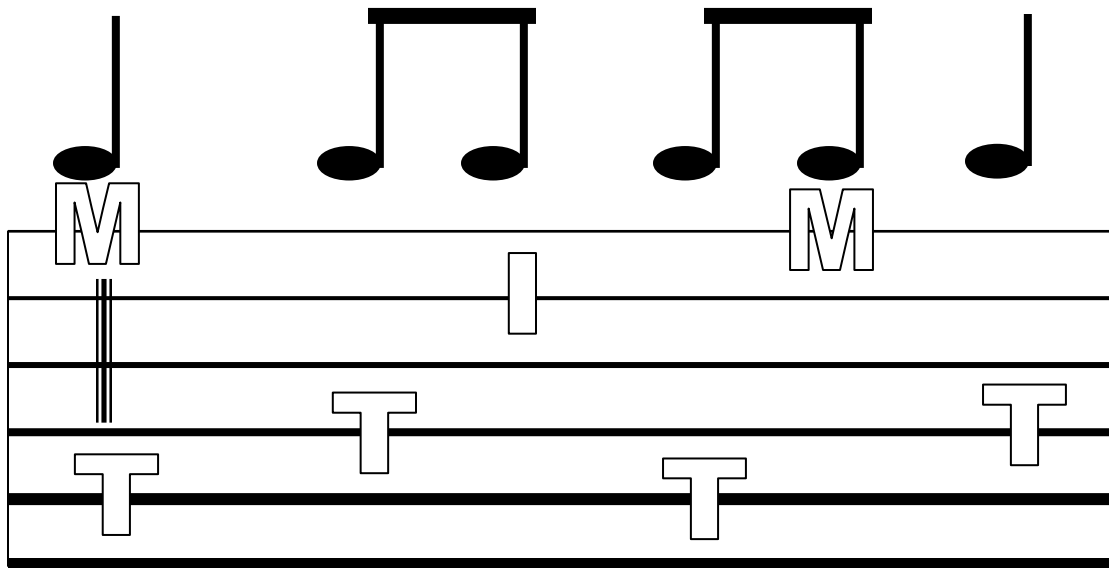
4/4 TIME GUITAR FINGER PICKING PATTERN
FOR THE RIGHT HAND ONLY:

Country Picking Style Pattern



The first beat of this pattern starts out with the right hand thumb and middle finger playing at the same time. The line connecting the letter M and T at the beginning of this pattern tells you that you should play these two fingers at the same time. This is called a “pinch”. T=Thumb, I=Index finger, M=Middle finger, R=Ring finger.


The pattern has a verbal rhythm that sounds like this:
one – two and – three and - four




